
THE SURVEY

Online survey of 1,500 eligible voters in Ontario conducted from May 5 to 9, 2022.

The margin of error for a comparable probability-based random sample of the same size is +/- 2.6%, 19 times out of 20.

The data were weighted according to census data to ensure that the sample matched Ontario's population according to age, gender, educational attainment, and region. Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding.






ONTARIO PROVINCIAL VOTE INTENTION







WHAT IS THE STRUCTURE OF THE VOTE?




PROVINCIAL VOTE INTENTION BY REGION






PROVINCIAL VOTE INTENTION BY UNION MEMBERSHIP




PROVINCIAL VOTE INTENTION BY HOMEOWNERSHIP








PROVINCIAL VOTE INTENTION BY CAR OWNERSHIP




PROVINCIAL VOTE INTENTION BY 2021 FEDERAL VOTE










